COCA Member Profile

John Sargeant

John was born in Greensboro, NC, in 1944. His father was an NCO in the U.S. Air Force (Sergeant Sargeant!), so John's family moved around a lot, and he lived in nine different states, plus France. He had gotten a beginner's driver permit at age 13 in Florida, a permit in Mississippi at 14, and one in Texas at age 15, but then his dad got orders for France. Just before they left for Europe in 1959, John tried to talk his dad into buying a Corvaír, which had just come out, but his dad said no. When they arrived in France, John learned that there he would have to wait until he was eighteen to get a driver's license, so he had to settle for a Peugeot moped. While living in France, John visited Berlin, a year after the Wall went up, and he saw the poor living conditions of the East Berliners under the communist system. John's family returned to the States and came to Oklahoma, where he first rode in a Corvaír, a new 1964 Spyder convertible a friend had purchased. He graduated from OSU in 1966 and married his wife, Judy, that same year. They have three kids, two boys and a girl. John started out working for a home designer, and then an architect, and that led to him being a building inspector. He went on to oversee the construction of the first big Hobby Lobby warehouse in southwest Oklahoma City. In 1982 he bought an old 1957 Chevy and restored it, and he also owned some motorcycles, including a BMW. At some urging from his wife, he sold the BMW bike in 2016 and bought a 1963 Corvaír Spyder coupe on eBay. The car wasn't quite as good as the seller had implied, so he has been restoring it ever since. He stripped it to bare metal and found only minor rust, primarily in the cowl area and the lower doors and rocker panels. Members of our club have been very helpful in the restoration process. The body is now mostly repainted, the engine is in, but the transaxle, which had to be sent to Michigan for a rebuild, still needs to be installed. He has an air conditioning set for the car, but is holding off on installing it until he has a chance to drive it around some. John now lives in southwest Oklahoma City.

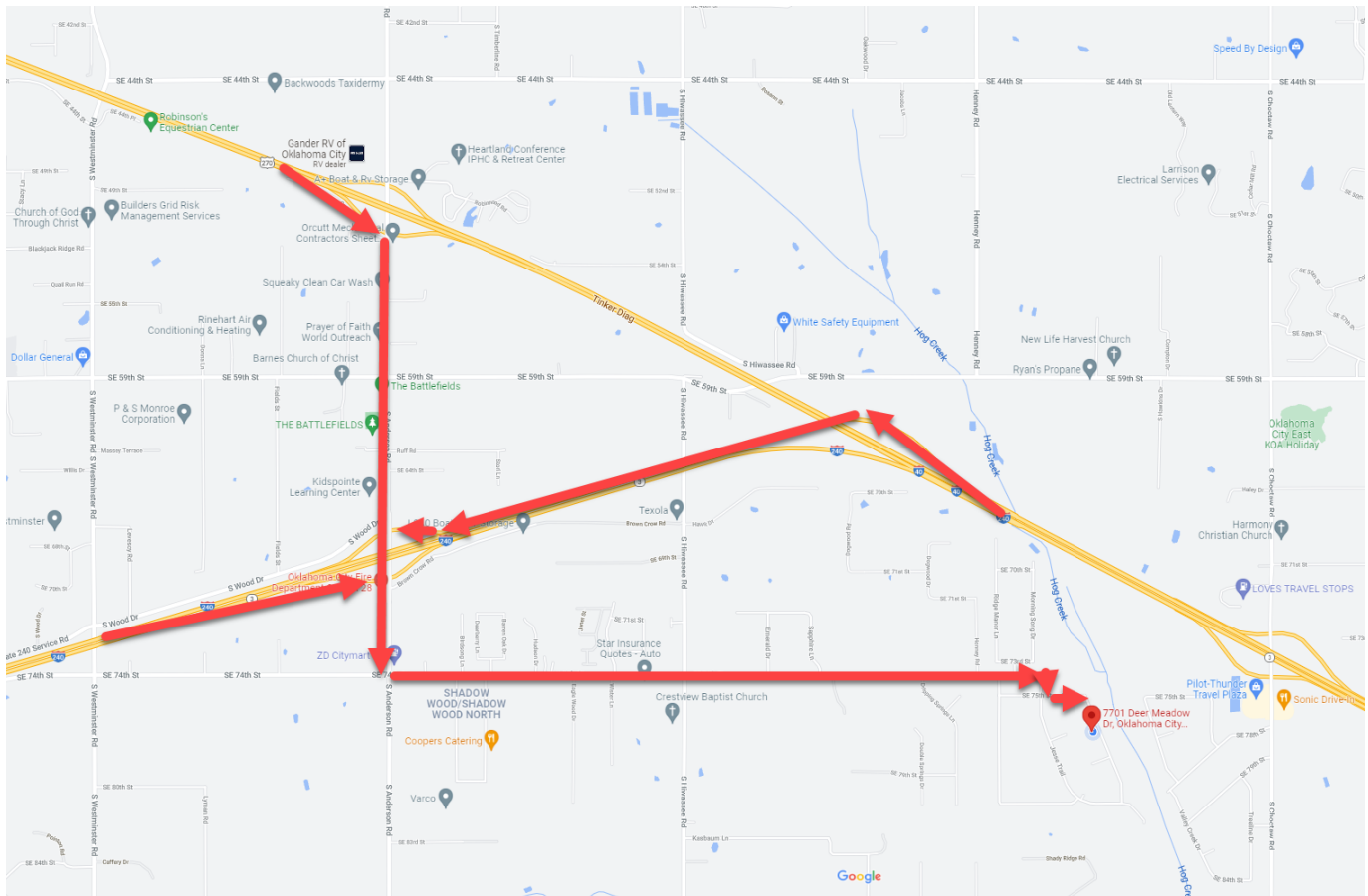

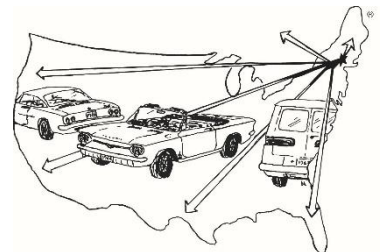
