# Bob's Tech Corner

First.....What is Powder Coating?

Powder coating is a different way to “paint” your metal parts. Instead of using traditional paint, the color is applied onto the metal’s surface with a special Powder coating gun that gives the powder an electrical charge. Then the part is placed in an electric type oven and cured with heat.

I enjoy powder coating because it provides my parts with a great looking and durable finish.

DIY powder coatings come in many colors including chromes and clears. There are several Powder wholesalers/retailers available to the DIYer and automotive hobbyist.

As you can see, there are various types of powders that can be used for your project. However, do some research or consult with one of the Powder venders to figure out the best powder for your project! Powder coating is a mixture of polymer resin, flow modifiers, leveling agents, and other additives. The ingredients are melted, mixed, cooled, and then finally ground into powder.

For the application process, you will use an electrostatic paint sprayer. Several consumer or entry level Powder coating guns are on the market. Eastwood and Harbor Freight currently have them available. Craftsman sold a self-contained a powder coating “System” several years ago that you can still find online for around \$100.00 With their system you did not need to own a compressor. These Powder coating “guns” do not spray as does a paint gun but rather use very low pressure to make a ‘Cloud” of powder that attaches to the metal part you are working with. The powder coating gun has an electrode that provides a positive electrical charge on the powder, which attaches to your metal parts. The powder sticks to the metal part because you previously grounded the part you are coating with a ground strap from the control box of the unit you are using. Notice too that you can also ground the metal Hanger or rack the part is on. The powder coating gets stronger once it’s HEAT cured because the powders melt together and solidify. You can also add more coats, like clear or a translucent color over chrome to your part if you want. Thicker layers mean added protection for your parts. The effects of the translucent over chrome can give dramatic results as well.

Powder coating is an excellent choice for application in pretty much any Corvaír project! As long as your oven is large enough to “COOK” the part. Understandably, it’s hard to step out on a limb and try something new! You don’t always know what will happen during the HEATING process, so experiment before you coat the parts that you will put into service. More and more people use powder coating for their projects instead of using paint. As paint comes with problems like running, dry time, fading and chipping. Especially when newly painted parts come in direct contact with engine heat or a gasoline leak. Paint can be destroyed quickly in a Corvaír engine bay! Once your metals have been powder coated, it becomes highly resistant to wear and tear no matter what you put it through. You should have fewer issues with chipping or peeling. However, if you do, find a deep scratch or a chip, the powder coated part that has a chip or scratch, can be sanded smooth and simply re- coated and using the same powder .... a perfect color match!

Due to its high-resistance capabilities, powder coating is perfect for metals that come in constant contact with sunlight and hot engines and fuel spillage. i.e. leaks on Corvaír engine tin! I like it for all my suspension parts as well.

A common question is, “How long does a powder coat finish last?” The answer I found in my research..... is roughly about 20 years!

Powder coating has been proven to increase the durability of your metal parts, and so they are easy to maintain. That doesn't mean they won't get dirty; dust and other factors can decrease the appearance of your beautiful powder coating job. You'll only need to wash your metals with some water, and the metal coating will remain intact. With this easy maintenance, you can use your parts for extended periods without worry.

Also, powder coating powder has an extended shelf life, so you'll be able to store it without any problems. Regular paints can dry out and expire or the tips on a rattle can clog rendering the rattle can ineffective and unusable unless you know how to "DECANT" the paint and spray it out of an air brush. This can be addressed at another time.

So..... instead of using paint on your next Corvaír project, save yourself the hassle by investing in some powder coating equipment instead. You will find that it is a tremendously satisfying process and a lot of fun!





# COCA Member Profile

David was born in St. Louis, MO, but grew up in Illinois. As a teenager, he read all the custom car magazines and dreamed of owning his own. At age 17, while riding the bus, he saw a new 1965 Corvair coupe with black interior at a dealer and fell in love with it. Unfortunately, it was out of his price range. He went into the Air Force, and was initially assigned to Wichita, KS, but soon was off to sunny Southeast Asia. When he returned to an Air Force Base in Arizona in 1969, he needed a car. He found a used 1965 Corvair 500 that was within his budget, and the used car dealer even paid to have the heater repaired. He drove it back and forth to the AFB and really enjoyed it. One day it wouldn't start, and an older sergeant told him to push start it, even though it was an automatic. That worked, and then he was able to buy a new battery.

Later the car began making a chirping noise, and he determined the problem was a blown head gasket. Working in his carport, he pulled the heads and the jugs, got them machined, and put it back together without breaking anything. After that it ran great. When he was reassigned to another air base, one in Tucson, and was planning to get out of the Air Force, he sold it.

He returned to Illinois, but within a few weeks decided to reenlist in the Air Force. At that time he was driving his mother's old 1959 Ford. A buddy had a 1965 Corvair coupe that wasn't running, so David traded his Ford for it. He traced the Corvair's problem to a clogged fuel line, fixed it, and had a good running car. When the Air Force reassigned him to Tucson, he sold it. His next tour was in Germany, and he went looking for a Corvair there. He found one sitting in someone's backyard, but the owner refused to sell it to him.

His next assignment was in New Mexico, at Holloman AFB. He bought a 1964 convertible based on photos and info from a man in Texas, but it turned out to be worse than it had been presented. Nonetheless, he brought it back to NM and fixed it up. He soon had a Corvair van, but its engine was bad. An Air Force buddy had a Greenbriar that wasn't running, so David bought it, fixed the engine, and swapped it into his van.

On a trip to northern New Mexico, outside of Santa Fe, the van began running rough, so he pulled off the road next to a high chain link fence with no trespassing signs. While he was checking out the engine, armed men surrounded him and demanded he leave immediately. He had inadvertently stopped on the road to Los Alamos National Laboratory, where nuclear weapons were built. David quickly reset the points and moved on.


While he was at Holloman he was one of the founding members of a Corvair club, but after he left the club eventually faded away. From NM David came to Tinker AFB and bought three more Corvairs. When he was reassigned to Japan, he sold all his cars and parts, telling his wife he was done with Corvairs, and would concentrate on woodworking. When he returned to Oklahoma, however, he started buying Corvairs again, including the gold 1967 coupe he still drives.
