What beautiful weather we've been having the last few weeks! It makes me want to get Christine out, drop the top and go cruisin'!





Bob's Tech Corner

This tip comes at the request of a few members wanting to equip their cars with an oil pressure gauge.

In my research I have come across the members on the national level that equipped their CORSA dashes with almost identical gauges from other Chevrolet's. You late model Monza guys will need to get an aftermarket gauge or a three gauge cluster to mount it or them, where you can find space. OR a Quad gage cluster in the center (clock) position. For the Corsa gauge cluster specifically, I have found that some enthusiasts are using 83-85 S10 gauge. However, although they seem to be close to a good fit, they are electric and use a large sending unit. They also have that pesky oil can icon at the bottom of the gauge. Just so you know! On eBay they seem to go for around \$30, plus you will need a sending unit, another cost! Another gauge that is being used is the one out of the 73-80 Chevy GMC Truck, or the C10 K5 K10 Silverado. These gauges can be mechanical or electric and eBay's prices are anywhere from \$30 used to \$59.95 new. The mechanical ones that I looked at, show only "PSI", not the oil can icon at the bottom of the gauge! These tend to be the earlier models ie... the 70s era. Also, the 80-82 Malibu and El Camino can be used, and are a good source. Check those prices, they keep going up! To install an electric Oil pressure gauge, you will need 1 steel (NOT brass or copper!) 1/8th pipe nipple, not more than a few inches long and brass "T" fitting. Remove your sending unit and install the pipe nipple in its place. You can then install the "T" with the "T" on its side. You will have one hole up and one to the side. Install the stock sending unit in the side and the electrical unit in the top. Don't get too long of the pipe nipple least it weaken and brake due to engine vibration! be sure to route the wire next to the alternator and under the fan belt!!, then to the front of your car. Your stock sending unit's wire can run as it did before.

You will need to remove the alternator to tighten the pipe nipple. Also be careful that you aim the pressure switch a bit to the right so it doesn't end up too close to the Alt fan pulley. Therefore, be careful as you reinstall your Alternator.

PLEASE NOTE:

Clarks sells an adaptor that replaces the Oil filter bolt, to be able to run an oil gauge. Adapt-a-bolt. Be sure to check your manufacturer for their elect. sending units SIZE. Some can get pretty bulky. The mechanical gauges are actually easier to install, due to, in my opinion, the relative small size of the fittings to get them hooked up. Also note that if you run the mechanical gauge to the front, there will be a small delay in the oil pressure readings. Inasmuch as there are as many ways to install a gauge of any kind, as there are Corvair owners, I will not give instructions on how to install your gauge inside the cab.. If you need to install it in your gauge cluster, Corsa or Monza, the above mentioned gauges will fit your openings fairly well. A couple of vendors sell brackets to mount aftermarket gauges to either the Corsa or the Monza and 500 models. Several on the Corvair blogs have opted to go with the most modern gauges available with GPS speedometers, and spend upwards of \$900.00! YMMV! There are also Multi gauges (Quad) that will fit in the Center gauge hole or replace the fuel gauge in the late mode Monza and /or 500s. You can find them on Speed Hut or Jegs. However, Look to spend close to \$400 or more! Remember that in a driving situation you will not be monitoring your gauge cluster very often. How often do you check out the vacuum gauge or look at your clock? Usually we are watching our Tachs and/or Speedometers. I think that is why the engineers at Chevrolet put in the idiot lights, they get your attention faster than that little orange needle that has fallen below the desired pressure. Enjoy your Corvair as you drive to our next meeting! See you there! Bob Welch


